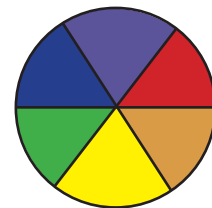
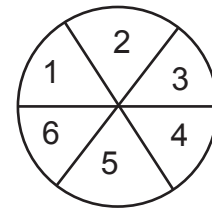
art activity

The Color Wheel

Artists use a color wheel to mix and blend color. The color wheel is based on three primary colors; red, yellow and blue. Artists blend these primary colors in a variety of ways to create new and interesting colors. Try this simple exercise to discover what colors come from. 20 minutes

Directions

1. Draw a circle on your piece of paper
2. Divide the circle into six equal parts →
3. Fill in Space 1 with blue pastel
4. Fill in Space 3 with red pastel
5. Fill in Space 5 with yellow pastel
6. With a clean finger blend the blue and red pastel together in Space 2
7. Repeat with red and yellow in Space 4, and yellow and blue in Space 6 →



Materials

- Paper
- Pencil
- Pastels (red, yellow and blue)
